

TO YOUR HEALTH

Diabetes #2



When our body does not respond to its own insulin there is a huge build up of blood sugar that would usually be processed by our normal functions. This build up blocks tiny capillaries such as those around the eyes and extremities (feet and toes). Unchecked diabetes places the patient at significantly higher risk for heart attack and stroke. Apparently my heart attack of two years ago was diabetes induced.

It is imperative for those diagnosed with Type 2 Diabetes to receive careful nutrition training. What goes in the mouth ends up in the bloodstream. A low carb diet is not easy to follow, but it can save your life! The old joke is what must I give up if I am diabetic? Just three things... Anything white, anything sweet and anything good!

My dietary choices are changing, evolving. The first days are easier because the patient is usually in panic mode. We start playing mind games with ourselves. "It's just a small bowl of cereal. How many carbs can it have anyway?" Probably around 35 for just one cup! The typical cereal bowl holds about two cups. Learning what is safe to eat for meals and snacks is liberating. We must not give in to our hunger for favorite things. I have chosen to totally avoid my personal "landmines". Any food with potato is incredibly high in carbs. Rice, pasta, white bread, donuts, cereal (oatmeal can work), desserts, milk, yogurt, and anything Little Debbie.

One of the health risks of diabetes is how slow the detrimental effects take to fully arrive. This can give a false sense of safety while not altering one's lifestyle. Please know this. Diabetes always wins. Always. But diabetes is also a disease over which we ultimately have control. You are what you eat...so let's eat better.
