Working With the Best

But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working."

- John 5:17

How do you know when God is calling you? Many Holston Baptists have clearly answered God's call on their lives, whether it is to serve a local church as a pastor, or to lead a specific ministry that fits (more or less) the gifting of the Holy Spirit in their lives. What factors affect someone's ability to attempt great things for God?

Community

Ministry is often lonely and discouraging work. I have seen pastors approach church work like vigilantes, fighting sin and church problems on their own. I have been there, too.

It becomes very tempting to hang up the old cape and cowl. However, having a community of encouraging pastors and ministry leaders puts your own calling into perspective. This frees a minister to attempt great things for God.

Pastor or church leader, God has not called you to be alone. At least, not for long. Remember Elijah? He was called to be faithful in very dark days in Israel.

When he had reached the end of himself. God brought him to see the faithful remnant (1 Kings 19:1-18). In many ways, I feel that I have found a faithful remnant in Northeast Tennessee here at the HBA. **Apart** from your encouragement, prayer, and counsel, my wife and I would have never decided to move halfway across the country.

Service

I read an article last year that changed my view of ministry and reminded me of a few things I had forgotten. Entitled, Busyness," "Fruitless article warns against spinning the wheels of ministry without having clear Kingdom goals, like discipling others, engaging community with Gospel, or helping another local church. Spoiler alert: Troy wrote it as one of the newsletter articles for The Messenger.

It is easy to slip into habits of so-called ministry that lose sight of making disciples and teaching them to observe Jesus' commandments. While this might mean you need to change your ministry models, it definitely means that you need to keep the Great Commission in mind in every church ministry.

In Romans 12:3-8, Paul provides a quick list of spiritual gifts. It is clearly not exhaustive, as Dr. Hershael York pointed out at a recent men's conference. Why not? Because Paul does not intend for us to spend a great deal of time discovering our gifts. He intends us to use our gifts! We discover them by serving. In serving, God displays His glory through us and will entrust us with more talents for His purposes (Matt. 25:24-30).

He claims equality with God, who works at all times to uphold the universe by the word of His power (Heb. 1:3). It impacted His own ministry as Mediator (v. 21) and Judge (v. 22-23).

We can attempt great things for God because we expect great things of God (William Carey,). He has not stopped working through His people, and He will not stop working through you to reach Northeast Tennessee for the honor of His name.

Holston Baptists, it has been an honor to work with you. It is an even greater honor to know that our God is at work in us.

Keep teaching the Bible, keep practicing repentance, and keep attempting great things for God. I expect that He will do many great things through you for many years to come.




