What is a Ministry Pipeline?

In recent years you may have heard church denominational leaders talk about the need for a ministry pipeline. When you turn on the faucet in your kitchen, water is ready to come out and meet your needs. In a similar way, we want to see a pipeline of young men ready to answer God's call to serve in a local church as soon as He opens the door. The rising average age of pastors and the lack of young men ready to serve in local churches prove that over the past decade or two we have not done enough to prepare the next generation of pastors. Wishing and hoping that God will raise up leaders tomorrow has not gotten the job done. So, what should we do?

First, we need to regularly call out the called. Sunday School, small group discipleship, and corporate worship give weekly opportunities challenge men to answer God's call to serve His Church. Second, we need to provide opportunities for training and experience. All too often, I see resumes of men who have answered the call to serve the Lord but have very little training and very little experience. We can do better! Our churches can provide regularly opportunities for the called to clarify and exercise

their gifts. While I encourage every called man to get all the formal training he can, we can begin basic training at the local church. We simply need pastors and other church leaders to invest time and possibly money preparing the next generation. Most of our churches could even provide a scholarship for a seminary student! Third, we have to send them out. Unless God opens the door for them to serve in their home church, most called men must be sent out. Yes, you must give up some of your most gifted servants for the sake of the Kingdom. Fear not! When your church begins to focus more sending than on receiving, you'll find that God will continue to give you new people to send.

If this new focus seems overwhelming, we're here to help. If your church is not quite ready to begin that process on your campus, we have a pipeline ready to begin this fall. Here's a list of the areas we will cover:

- Calling & Character
- Spiritual Disciplines
- People Skills & Leadership
- Preaching
- Local Church Dynamics
- Training/Ministry Assignment



September 6th, 2025 8:00am - 12:00pm Southwestern Baptist Church in Johnson City, Tennessee will be hosting a 4-hour Tactics & Firearms Handling class for Armed Protectors on Saturday, September 6th, 2025, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This dry practice (non-live fire) course is designed for anyone currently carrying a firearm or interested in learning how to handle one safely in a crowded environment. The class takes place indoors at the church and is suitable for all skill levels, including (but not limited to) church security team members, law enforcement, beginners, or interested congregation members.

Participants will explore realistic response strategies tailored to church environments and learn how to reduce risk through proper training. No handgun license is required, and you do not need to be on a security team to attend. Training guns and holsters will be provided, and class size is limited to 35 participants. If the morning class fills up, we will run an additional class at 1pm.
